Remember you are coming to a farm. Please bring suitable footwear. The nights get cold and the days get hot, please pack accordingly.


George Stedman Watts arrived in Perth, Western Australia from The United Kingdom on the ship The Medina in July 1830.

On his arrival to the colony George had several occupations, one of them being a Chainer for the Survey Department. He also applied for the contract for carrying mail between Perth and Fremantle which he was granted.

George lived in serval areas of Perth but in March 1855 he was granted land in the Canning River district which he farmed with his sons until the 1890s.

In 1861 George Stedman Watts was granted land in Wandering and this land was later to be known as "Grassdale". In 1866 George Stedman Watts transferred the land to his sons George and John Watts .

George and his wife Amelia moved to Grassdale to live with their sons George and John in the 1890's. George died at Grassdale on May 26th, 1889 at the age of 85.



NO DRONES PERMITTED DURING THE WEEKEND! As we have helicopter flights and fireworks planned for the event, drones are not permitted.

We don't have a shop in town. Please bring your essential items with you.

FOOD VANS

We will have food vans available: Friday - 12pm onwards Saturday - 7am onwards Sunday 7am - 9am - breakfast

FIREWORKS

Fireworks will be set off roughly around 9.30pm. Local residents please ensure your pets are secured safely for the evening.

Campers, if you intend to go to bed early that night, we plan on waking you up

WANDERING CWA

CWA will have their rooms open from 9:30am - 1pm on Saturday 19th October for Devonshire Teas.

Call in on your way to Grassdale (Watts St) or the Community oval (Down St)

NO ESKIES PERMITTED INTO THE MAIN PADDOCK. Non-alcoholic beverages brought into The Main Paddock must be in original sealed containers. Jackets and bags will be searched at entry.



CAMPING

VEHICLES

You can park your vehicle at your campsite. However, if you require the use of your vehicle throughout the weekend, you will need to park it in the General Parking Area at the front of the property. There is NO Vehicle movement permitted in the Camp Grounds once you have set up your campsite. This is in place to help keep everyone safe in the camp grounds.

CAMP FIRES

NO CAMP FIRES are permitted at the camp grounds! PLEASE LEAVE YOUR FIREWOOD AT HOME! Gas patio heaters are permitted.

PETS

Grassdale is a broadacre and livestock farm. **NO PETS** are permitted on site as they pose a biosecurity risk and a risk to livestock. Please leave your pets at home.

Dogs participating in the Ag Show dog jumping competition, must be kept on a lead prior to and after the competition and are not permitted access to any other areas of the property such as The Main Paddock and Camp Grounds.

POWER

All campsites are **UNPOWERED**. If you require power at your site you will need to bring a generator. We ask that all generators are turned off by 10pm.

TOILETS AND SHOWERS

There are showers and toilets located on each camp ground. If you can be a self contained camper, we would recommend it due to the number of people attending the event.

PLEASE BRING:

Good flat shoes, the paddocks can be a mixture of grass, sand, rubble.

Plenty of warm clothes, blankets, socks, beanie etc as the nights can get very cold!

Hat and sunscreen because the days can get quite warm.

Mozzie spray.

Picnic blanket, chair - if you're attending the Evenings in the Paddock.

GAZEBOS:

No gazebos permitted in The Main Paddock for the Evenings in the Paddock.

If you are using a gazebo at your campsite, please ensure it is weighted and tied down correctly.

DRINKING WATER:

Potable water stations are located throughout the venue. Please bring a containers suitable for filling.



When you arrive to site you will be ushered into the General Parking Paddock.

While you wait in the General Parking for your turn at check-in, please make sure you have your tickets ready for scanning. You will need access to the QR code that was emailed to you when you purchased your tickets. Every person entering will need access to their code.

If you made a group booking, please make sure the others in your group have access to their ticket prior to them getting to check-in. You can not collect wrist bands for other people who are not at check-in with you.

After you have done check-in and received your wrist bands, you will then be able to make your way to your campsite. Bays are marked on the ground in white paint. Please stay within your bay when parking you van etc.

All bays are 10x10m.

CHECK-IN/OUT TIMES

Thursday:

Early check-in fee applies of \$50 per campsite. Payable online prior or at the gate with eftpos or cash. This night is for **SELF CONTAINED CAMPERS ONLY**. No onsite facilities are available Thursday night.

8am - 7pm

Saturday - no access to driveway while the Ag Show is in progress (9am-3pm)

7am - 9am

3pm - 7pm

If you are arriving before check-in times, please park in the General Parking Paddock, located at the front of the property. DO NOT block the driveway before check-in time opens. Event vehicles and service providers need to access the property either side of the check-in times and the driveway is single lane access.

Please do not pull up along the main road, to reduce traffic congestion.

CAMPING IN A GROUP

If you are camping in a group, it's best to arrive together to ensure your sites are next to each other. We would prefer groups to arrive together wherever possible to help make the checkin process guick and easy for everyone.
